#### **Basic Structure**

- Economy-wide cap-and-trade program
- Separate phase-down for HFCs
- Performance standards for some non-covered sources
- EPA administers program
- Addresses Clean Air Act interaction

#### **Offsets: context**

- Principles: flexible, low-cost abatement option
- Quality standard
- Differentiation among different parts of offsets: domestic, international, forestry, early action
- A discussion draft
- Political climate for offsets?

#### **Domestic Program**

- EPA administers program, some consultation with USDA
- Limits on use: firm-level limits, beginning at 5% and rising to 35%
- Allowed offsets no greater than delta between cap and BAU

### Eligibility

- Striking a balance on eligibility
- Eligibility structure
  - **1.** Positive list: statutory eligibility
  - 2. Potentially eligible: EPA must review and make determination on enumerated types
  - 3. Petition process for non-listed types

#### **Program rules**

- Additionality: common practice element?
- Baseline and measurement
- 3<sup>rd</sup> party verification
- Voluntary project approval process

# Program rules, continued

- Crediting period: not less than 5 years, no greater than 10 years for non-AR projects
- Leakage
- Impermanence

## International offset credits

- International offsets: discretion to Administrator in establishing approved types
- Destruction of HFCs ineligible
- International emission allowances: qualifying intl. program

#### **International Forestry**

International forestry

- Emissions volume
- Evolving international dialogue
- National vs. sub-national
- What's next?

#### **Early Action**

- Under construction
- One bin for state allowances (RGGI, CA) and offsets
- Picking one date for a dividing line?
